Procurement Advisory: White House Tariffs & Impact on Purchases

What's Happening?

The White House has recently implemented a new wave of tariffs affecting a broad range of imported goods. These changes are beginning to impact procurement activities across Emory.

We are now seeing **tariff-related fees included on invoices**, currently ranging between **6% and 10%**, depending on the product and country of origin. These additional costs can have a direct effect on departmental budgets and planned expenditures.

What Do I Need to Do?

We strongly encourage all departments to **plan ahead**, assess critical supply needs early, and consult with Procurement if you anticipate large purchases or time-sensitive orders. Being proactive can help minimize disruption and avoid unexpected budget strain.

- **Price Increases**: Be aware that products you've previously purchased may now carry higher costs.
- **Shipping Delays**: Customs processing times may increase, so lead times could be longer than usual.
- **Product Substitutions**: Some suppliers may shift their offerings due to sourcing challenges or cost impacts.
